SUMMER STUDY	Community of Scholars Program: allows high school students to take a 3-credit course that blends a week of online learning with two weeks of traditional on-campus classes. The program introduces students to the advancing fields of U.S. foreign policy, international conflict resolution, and global environmental politics. Discover the World of Communication: Open to all high school students. Activities, guest speakers, events, and field trips occur regularly throughout the summer. Summer Institutes: Offers rising junior and senior high school students and recent graduates a two-week, immersive seminar that features field experts, lectures, and site visits. EducationUSA Academy: For international students only. Introduces students to all aspects of academic life while improving academic English, receiving guidance on the university admission process, touring area colleges and universities, and engaging in cultural, community and sports activities. 1 credit, 2 week course in Advanced English Language Courses, History and Practices of U.S. Higher Education, American Culture, and Public Health.

Discover Hopkins: 2-week mini-term programs focused primarily on the sciences. 3 terms offered in total. Must be 15-17 years old. Cost can include room and board or be program only.

English as Second Language: The summer program provides complete language immersion. The full-time program provides at least 22 hours of classroom instruction per week. 5-week term from July 2-August 3, 2018.
